And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on those who will select the next rector of Saint Paul's. Give them wisdom and discernment in the work that they do on our behalf. God in your mercy.

Hear our prayer.

Give us the grace to be joyful and to give thanks in all circumstances. We name before you, either silently or aloud, those things and people in this church for which we are thankful.

The People may add their own thanksgivings.

God in your mercy.

Hear our prayer.

Help us to pray without ceasing all the days of our lives and sanctify us through and through. God in your mercy,

All this we ask in the name of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who rose triumphant from the grave and who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
